Comedy, directed by Marcel Varnel. Starring George Formby, Kathleen Harrison, Hilda Bayley & Jimmy Clitheroe. A handyman with well-meaning intentions gets into trouble with a nude painting.

British Transport Film
Berth 24 (1950)**

Directed by J.B. Holmes. With William Devlin and Richard Huson. First production of the newly formed British Transport Film Unit. In the Hull Docks, the steamer S.S. Bravo arrives from Gothenburg with various cargoes.



**Monday 22nd April 19 15:25
The Wicked Lady (1945)**

Drama, directed by Leslie Arliss. Starring Margaret Lockwood, Griffith Jones & James Mason. 17th Century beauty Barbara Worth leads a double life to relieve her boredom.



**Monday 22nd April 19 18:20
Northwest Frontier (1959)**

Adventure, directed by J. Lee Thompson. Starring Kenneth More, Lauren Bacall, Herbert Lom. In 1905 India, British army officer Captain Scott (Kenneth More) is charged with protecting a six-year-old Hindu prince from would-be Muslim assassins.



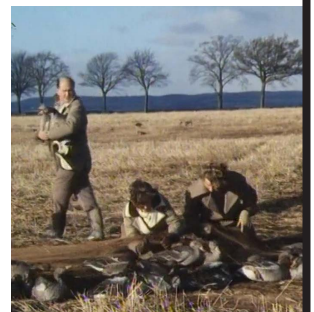
**Tuesday 23rd April 19 12:00

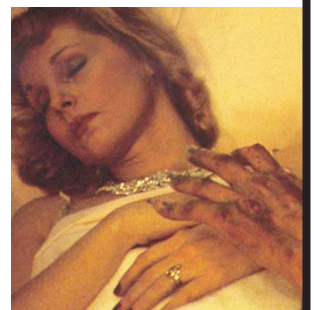
**Tuesday 23rd April 19 18:10

British Transport Film Blue Pullman (1960)

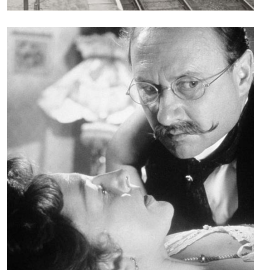
Directed by James Ritchie. The "Blue Pullman", a new diesel train liaising between Manchester and St. Pancras is prepared for its grand inaugural journey.

Carve Her Name With Pride (1958)

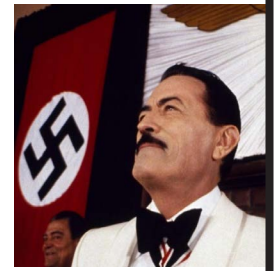

The Boys From Brazil (1978)

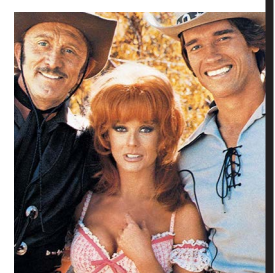

The Villain (1979)

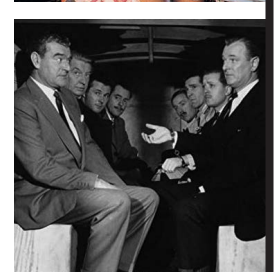

The League Of Gentlemen (1960)

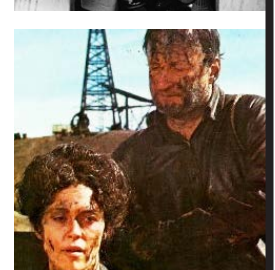
