THE GO BETWEEN comes to Talking Pictures TV

Starring **Julie Christie, Alan Bates, Margaret Leighton, Michael Redgrave** and **Dominic Guard**. Directed by: **Joseph Losey**. *The Go Between* won the Grand Prix at the 1971 Cannes Film Festival and was adapted by Harold Pinter from the book by LP Hartley. The film achieved unanimous critical acclaim, and was seen by many as the peak of the careers of the actors involved. It remains a beautiful and atmospheric interpretation of a truly poignant story about a secret love affair between a beautiful heiress and a poor tenant farmer, who can only communicate via a young boy. **Airs: Saturday 8th June 20:25**



SHADOWS - a haunting new children's series to show on Talking Pictures TV

Featuring guest actors including **John Nettleton, Gareth Thomas, Jenny Agutter, Pauline Quirke, Brian Glover, June Brown, Rachel Herbert, Jacqueline Pearce** and **Jenny Agutter** – as well as **Russell Hunter** reprising his *Ace of Wands* villain, Mr Stabs. *Shadows* was produced from 1975-1978.

The series featured ghost and horror dramas for children and was nominated for a BAFTA TV award. Producers Ruth Boswell and Pamela Lonsdale – both renowned for many landmark children's series, including *Timeslip*, *Dramarama* and *The Tomorrow People* – assembled an outstanding team of writers, including J.B. Priestley, Trevor Preston, Penelope Lively, Rosemary Harris, Joan Aiken and Fay Weldon. Atmospheric and superbly scripted, this remarkable series gave '70s schoolkids an unforgettable collection of spine-tingling tales.

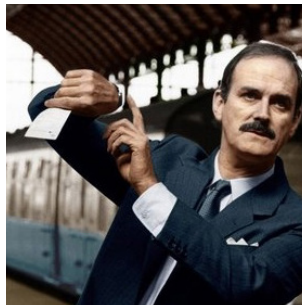
