GET SOME IN! Comes to Talking Pictures TV

Starring: **David Janson, Tony Selby, Gerard Ryder, Brian Pettifer and Robert Lindsay.** Directed by **Michael Mills.** This long-running series was a humorous portrait of life in the RAF for a group of young conscripts during the 1950's. The group servicemen have to try to survive the discipline inflicted by their evil drill instructor, Corporal Marsh. The square bashing and boot polishing are cleverly contrasted with the coffee bars and rock'n'roll music of the era. The series was written between 1975–1978 by comedy duo John Esmonde and Bob Larbey, who also wrote *Please Sir, The Good Life, and Ever Decreasing Circles.* **Get Some In!** airs Monday 1st July at 18:00 and continues on weekdays at the same time.
