As if his duck 'n' dodge life was not complicated enough, with such low-life characters as the grubby Grogan (Rio Fanning) and the dangerous Laughing Spam Fritter (John Rhys-Davies) using him, Budgie had a girlfriend, Hazel (Lynn Dalby), with his baby, his wife Jean (Georgina Hale), and his busker/con-man father (George Tovey) to contend with.

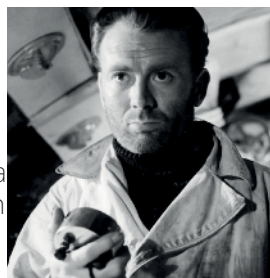
Saturday 20th June 10:30am
