The Rainbow Jacket (1954)

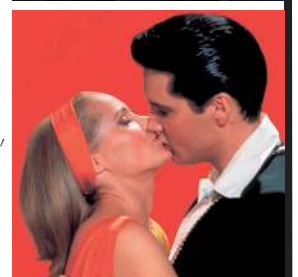
