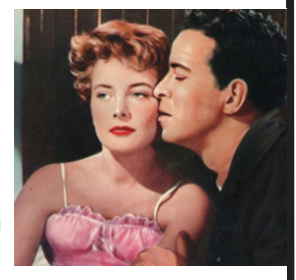
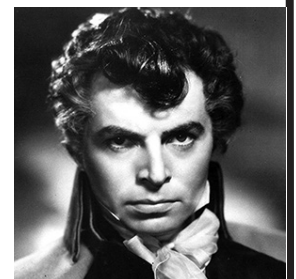
True as a Turtle (1957)
