The Way Out (1955) (AKA Dial 999)

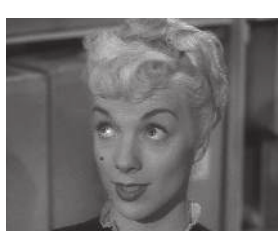
Crime. Director: Montgomery Tully.

They Knew Mr Knight (1946)

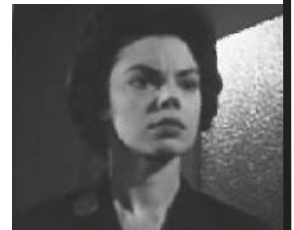
