The Bad Lord Byron (1949)

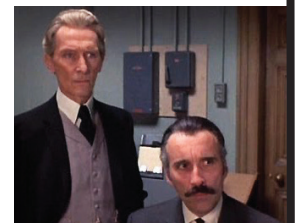
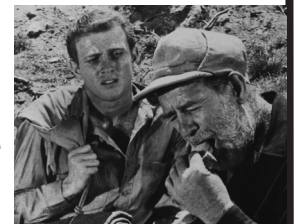

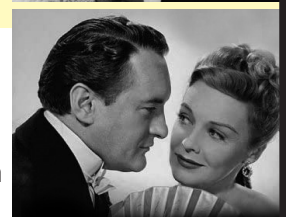
Jitterbugs (1943) 4:30pm
