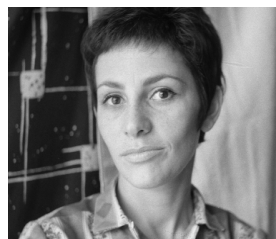
Monday 27th December 10.30am The High and the Mighty (1954)

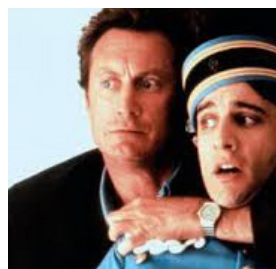
Monday 27th December 3pm Moss Rose (1947)

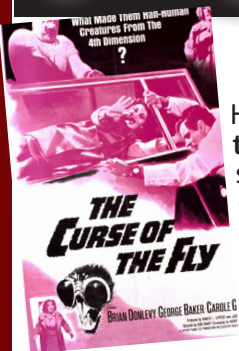
The Cellar Club **Week 17**

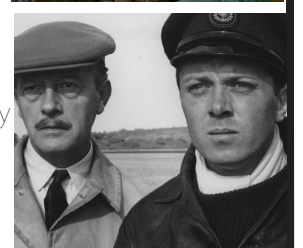
Sunday 2nd January 1.40pm **Genevieve** (1953)
