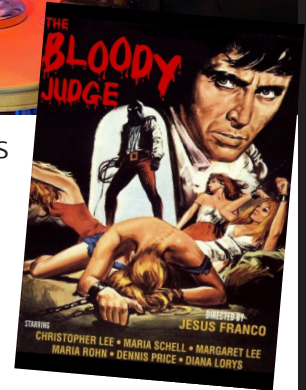
Join **Caroline Munro** at 'The Cellar Club'. Hello and welcome Cellar Dwellers!

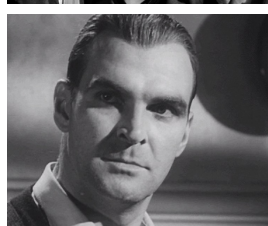
Friday 4th February 11.05am **Nicholas Nickleby (1947)**

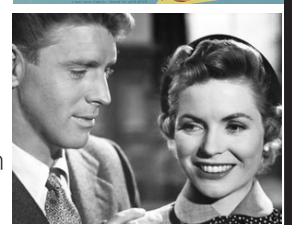
Sunday 6th February 11am **Suddenly (1954)**
