The film follows the history of a brooch after it is given as a present by a man to a woman in 1911.



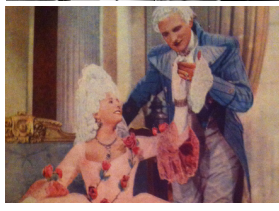
### **Monday 28th February 3.10pm Always a Bride (1953)**
