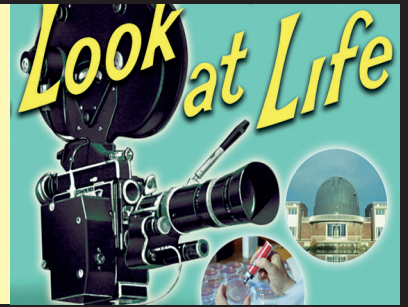

The Cellar Club

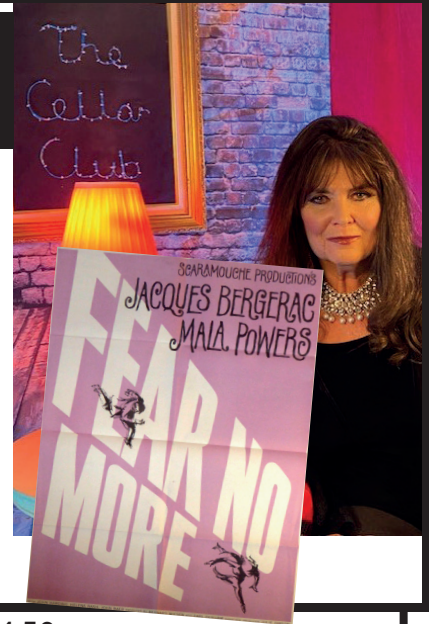
Friday 21st October - From 9pm!

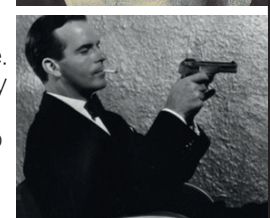
Thursday 20th October 6.05pm **Brighton Rock (1947)**
