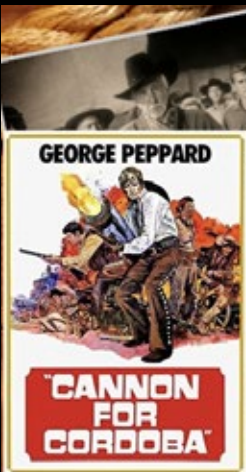
# SADDLE UP!
