THE DEATH OF ADOLF HITLER

1973. Drama. Directed by Rex Firkin. Stars Frank Finlay, Caroline Mortimer, Oscar Quitak, Ed Devereaux, Clifford Rose.

Set entirely in the Berlin bunker, this drama is a definitive study of Hitler at the end of his life. The play follows the last ten days in Hitler's life as his dream of a thousand year Reich became a drugged and paranoid nightmare, until his death by suicide.

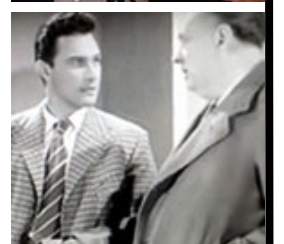
Tuesday 16th April 3.15pm

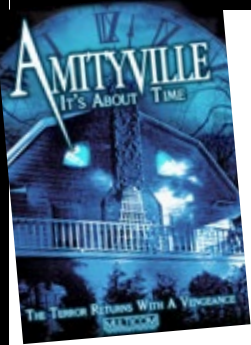


The Cellar Club

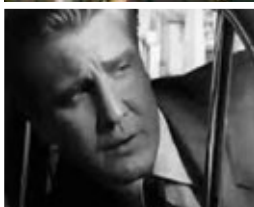
Thursday 18th April 7.30pm

Victoria the Great (1937) Starring Anna Neagle and Anton Walbrook. This was the first film to portray the life of one of this country's best-loved monarchs.



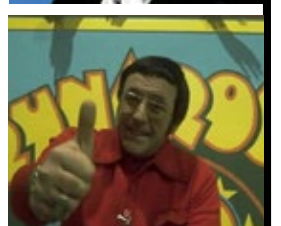
Friday 19th April 3.40pm

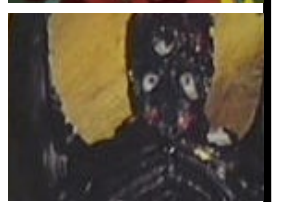

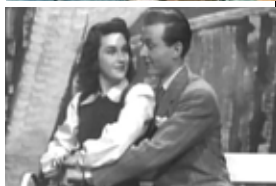
