GOLDENEYE

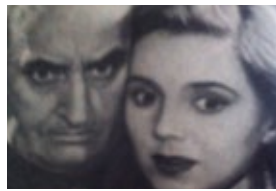

While I Live (1947) Drama. (aka The Dream of Olwen) 25 years later a spinster still obsesses over the death of her sister who was a composer. [S]



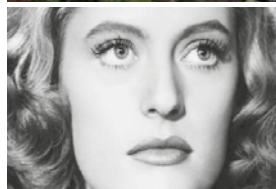

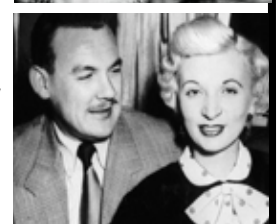
