Stars Gerald Harper. Kathy is in hospital after being shot and a flustered wife confesses that she knows who linked to the murders.

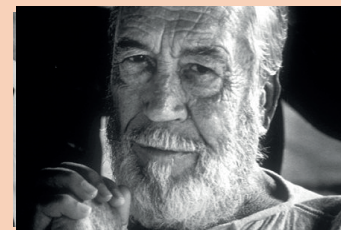


TUESDAY
