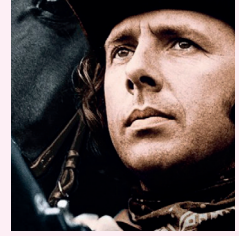
DICK TURPIN - NEW SERIES
