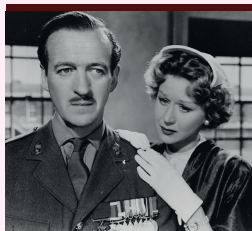


WHAT'S ON TALKING PICTURES TV?

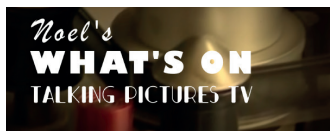
The Directors Mon 22nd June at 5.30pm Stanley Kubrick is considered one of the greatest and most influential directors in cinematic history. [S]

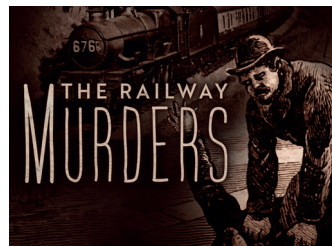

SUNDAY

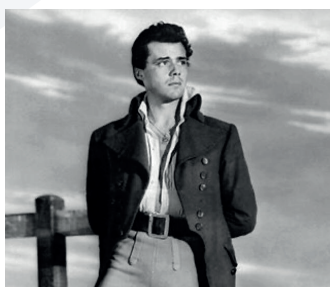
